Main Purpose of Job

To work as part of the WPM team to develop the life and ministry of WPM by making and growing disciples who can worship fully, love all and serve the city.

Core Tasks

- To mentor and disciple young adults in the Christian faith.
- To work as a lay Chaplain within WPM Chaplaincy.
- Through the use of drama, dance or other creative arts to engage with young adults and particularly those who are NEET or at risk of becoming NEET.
- To recognise and where necessary refer challenging behaviours or issues.
- To build and establish relationships with those not in education, employment or training who gather in Wolverhampton city centre.
- To establish and develop small discipleship groups for NEETs and to run and oversee the running of such groups.
- To promote opportunities on Sunday evenings as part of WPM for NEETs to use and develop gifts and skills.
- To develop new worshipping communities where appropriate to meet the spiritual needs of NEETs.
- To work with WPM volunteers in delivering courses and offering chaplaincy services.
- Write structured and concise reports of work undertaken.
- To assist the team leader in writing reports, applying for funding and with general administrative tasks.
- To be flexible to accommodate evening and weekend work.
- Establish good working relationships with key partners including local Churches, YMCA and Wolverhampton city council.
- To develop links with key people already working on interfaith issues
- To hold events to bring together young people and young adults from different faith backgrounds.
- To seek to develop or assist another organisation in setting up an interfaith project in Wolverhampton for young people and young adults.

- Assisting the WPM team leader with the supervision and support of some key volunteers.
